Ignorance plus easy credit equals disaster (Prov. 27:23-24)

Four things you must know:

- 3. I need to know what I earn.

- II. Know where you'll spend your money: Planned Spending

Setting financial goals and sticking to them is essential (Prov. 21:5)

Three common American addictions:

- 3. Credit chaos
- III. Know you'll need money for your future: Planned Savings

The average American has \$12,000 in credit card debt (Prov. 6:6-11)

IV. Know the power of contentment: Purpose to be Happy

V. Know the power of your tithe in God's hand: Perfect Provision
