FOUR COMMON WAYS GOD COMMUNICATES TO YOU

1. God's voice is in the Bible (2 Tim. 3:16-17 TLV; Rom. 15:4 NKJV)

How to Pick Up God's Voice in the Bible

- a. Pick a translation you can understand.
- b. Pick a time to read when you can concentrate.
- c. Pick an amount of time that is sensible.
- d. Pick a PrimeTime class to attend.
- 2. God's voice is in His Church (1 Cor. 14:24-25; 1 Thess. 2:13)

How to Pick Up God's Voice in His Church

- a. Pick yourself up and come consistently.
- b. Pick up a Christian radio station when in the car.
- c. Pick up a teaching tape from the tape ministry.
- d. Be more picky about your media consumption.
- 3. God's voice is in inward impressions (Neh. 2:12 NAS; Acts 27:9-12; 20-26)

How to Pick up on an impression from God

- a. Don't be a cynic.
- b. Don't be a mystic.
- c. Don't be insensitive.

4. God's voice is in our circumstances (Ps. 119:67 TLV; Amos 5:19; Ps. 20:30 TLV).

Two Personal Benefits of Hearing God's Voice

- 1. It protects me from mistakes (Job 33:14-17 TLV)
- 2. It provides wisdom for living (Prov. 4:10-12)
