James 4:11-12

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Do not speak evil of one another, brethren. He who speaks evil of a brother and judges his brother, speaks evil of the law and judges the law.

— James 4:11 NKJV

Two Reasons We Criticize

- 1. We love to accuse others and excuse ourselves (Rom. 2:3).
- 2. Our curiosity is always hungry (Prov. 26:22; 6:16-17).

Three Reasons We Should Not Criticize

- 1. It is <u>unchristian</u> (James 4:11; John 8:44).
- 2. It is <u>unloving</u> (James 4:11; 2:8).
- 3. It is unjustified (James 4:12).

Seven Reasons It is Wrong to Criticize

- 1. You are practicing the same <u>sin</u> (Rom. 2:1-3).
- 2. It blinds you to your own faults (Matt. 7:3-5).

- 3. When you draw conclusions based on <u>outward appearance</u> (John 7: 24; 1 Sam. 16:7).
- 4. Before you hear all the facts (John 7:51).
- 5. When extra-biblical <u>standards</u> are used (Rom. 14:1-4, 13; Col. 2:16).
- 6. When it devalues a brother or sister (James 4:11; Eph. 4:29).
- 7. When we assume we know inner motives (1 Cor. 4:5).

Three Strategies to Overcome the Criticizing Habit

- 1. Remember the principle of <u>sowing</u> and <u>reaping</u> (Matt. 7:1-2).
- 2. Remember we are accountable to God (Rom. 14:12-13).
- 3. Remember God's merciful <u>treatment</u> (James 2:13; Matt. 18:21-35).

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
